3 TIPS YOU CAN TEACH KIDS ABOUT THE NEWS

Is the source reliable? Not all information is created equal. Children should know that personal social media accounts express opinions where news organizations are required to meet accurate information standards.

Question Before Believing. It's tempting to take someone's word for it. A bias means having a strong opinion for or against something or someone. Do a background check as it's easy to let biases bend accurate information.

Be Responsive not Reactive. Wait for the details of the breaking news story before spreading information that has not been proven accurate.
